# La Crosse County Historical Society's Volunteers of the Year for 2025

At this year's Annual Meeting, two individuals were recognized for their outstanding contributions to our organization.

Barbara Albrechtson is a longstanding docent (13 years!) who leads tours of Hixon House with confident grace and aplomb, always in elegant costume. She is as comfortable teaching 2<sup>nd</sup>-graders about furniture ornament and old technologies as she is guiding groups of cruise boat passengers. She knows the history of the house and family well, and relates stories to visitors in a most compelling manner. Barb has also dedicated many hours outside of her Hixon House duties to transcribing old LCHS documents such as the lengthy Tribune insert from 2005 that detailed all the Phase I restoration work, and scores of old PPF newsletters, thereby providing a digital record of enormous value to LCHS and local researchers. During the year and a half with LCHS was without an Executive Director, Barb and our other honoree, Kathy Fuss, came into the office regularly to help with long-overdue organizational tasks such as sorting and filing old Board minutes. While this may not sound like much, it was of enormous help in getting more office files well-ordered. Finally, Barb has been a generous donor for years, providing her beautiful, handmade greeting cards to the Hixon House gift shop. They are exquisite, and you can find them filling the upright rack just next to the cahier's desk!

The second honoree, Kathy Fuss, is also a longstanding docent (18 years!) who has mastered the house and family history, as well as managed dozens of treasure hunts for our 2nd-grade field trip students. She loves working with children and has a special touch when helping them learn to look and understand what they see. Kathy is someone who will always step up to assist whenever we need a last-minute docent to fill a shift or provide a special tour, and for this, we are incredibly grateful. She also volunteers in the office, handling mundane tasks such as sorting office supplies and ironing tablecloths used for our events, as well as organizing important files. Working consistently as a "Silent City" volunteer guide is just another way she supports LCHS. However, perhaps the most valued quality of having Kathy on staff is her unwavering availability to meet any volunteer needs we have. We wish we had a nickel for every time that Kathy has offered to help in whatever way we need. We are much richer for Kathy's commitment to our organization!


